

Privacy Notice for Governors – How we use your information 2023/24

Who are we?

Grace Academy Darlaston is the 'data controller'. This means we are responsible for how your personal information is processed and for what purposes.

Grace Academy Darlaston is registered as the Data Controller with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) under Tove Learning Trust; Registration Number: Z7119841

What is a Privacy Notice?

A Privacy Notice sets out to individuals how we use any personal information that we hold about them. We are required to publish this information by data protection legislation. This Privacy Notice explains how we process (collect, store, use and share) personal information about our Governors/Trustees and other volunteers.

What is Personal Information?

Personal information relates to a living individual who can be identified from that information. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession.

'Special category' personal information reveals racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, or trade union membership, and the processing of biometric data for the purpose of uniquely identifying a natural person, data concerning health or data concerning a natural person's sex life or sexual orientation.

What personal information do we process about Governors/LGB Members and other volunteers

The categories of [Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers] information that we collect, hold and share include:

- personal information such as name, any former names, address, date of birth, occupation, nationality, telephone and email contact details,
- Records of Business and Pecuniary Interests
- Information from your References
- Evidence of any relevant qualifications
- Disclosure and Barring Service Certificate number and start date
- Self assessment skills audit
- Photographs

We may also collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) information that falls into "special categories" of more sensitive personal data. This includes:

- Information about any health conditions you have that we need to be aware of.
- Information about disability and access requirements.
- Information relating to criminal convictions and offences.

We may also hold data about that you that we have received from other organisations, including other schools

and social services, and the Disclosure and Barring Service in respect of criminal offence data.

For what purposes do we use personal information?

We use [Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers] data to:

- Establish good governance.
- Fulfill statutory obligations.
- Facilitate safe recruitment, as part of our safeguarding obligations.
- Undertake equalities monitoring.
- Communicate relevant information to individuals or groups or boards or Local Governing Bodies for the purpose of them carrying out their roles and responsibilities as a Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member other volunteer.
- Ensure that appropriate access arrangements can be provided to volunteers who require them.

Use of your personal data for marketing purposes

Where you have given us consent to do so, we may send you marketing information by email or text promoting school events, campaigns, charitable causes or services that may be of interest to you.

You can withdraw consent or 'opt out' of receiving these emails and/or texts at any time by contacting us (see 'Contact us' below).

Collecting Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers information

Whilst the majority of Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers' information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers information to us or if you have a choice in this.

What are the legal reasons for us to process your personal information?

We are required to process personal information in accordance with data protection legislation and only do so when the law allows us to. Data Protection law sets out the lawful reasons we have to process your personal information and these are as follows:

1) To comply with the law

We collect and use general purpose staff information in order to meet certain legal requirements and legal obligations placed upon the school by UK law. We therefore have the right to process your personal information for such purposes without the need to obtain your consent.

Details of the type of processing that we must undertake, the personal data that is processed, the legislation which requires us to do so and who we may share this information with is set out in Table 1.

2) To protect someone's vital interests

We are able to process personal information when there is an emergency and/or where a person's life is in danger. Details of the type of processing that we may undertake on this basis and who we may share that information is set out in Table 2.

3) With the consent of the individual to whom that information 'belongs'

Whilst much of the personal information is processed in accordance with a legal requirement, there is some personal information that we can only process when we have your consent to do so. In these circumstances, we will provide you with specific and explicit information regarding the reasons the data is being collected and how the data will be used.

Details of the type of processing that we may undertake on this basis and who we may share that information is set out in Table 3.

4) To perform a public task

It is a day-to-day function of Grace Academy Darlaston to ensure that Members/Trustees/Governors/LGB Members and other volunteers receive the training and support they require. Much of this work is not set out directly in any legislation but it is deemed to be necessary in order to ensure that Members / Trustees/ Governing

Boards / Local Governing Bodies and other volunteers are properly supported and able to fulfil their role and responsibilities.

Details of the type of processing that we may undertake on this basis and who we may share that information is set out in Table 4.

Special category personal information

In order to process 'special category' data, we must be able to demonstrate how the law allows us to do so. In addition to the lawful reasons above, we must also be satisfied that <u>ONE</u> of the following additional lawful reasons applies:

- 1) Explicit consent of the data subject.
- 2) Necessary for carrying out obligations and exercising specific rights in relation to employment and social security and social protection law.
- 3) Processing relates to personal data which is manifestly made public by the data subject.
- 4) Necessary for establishing, exercising or defending legal claims.
- 5) Necessary for reasons of substantial public interest.
- 6) Necessary for preventive or occupational medicine, or for reasons of public interest in the area of public health.
- 7) Necessary for archiving, historical research or statistical purposes in the public interest.

The lawful reasons for each type of sensitive category personal information that we process is set out in the tables below.

Who might we share your information with?

We routinely share Member/Trustee/Governor/LGB Member and other volunteers' information with:

- Local Authorities
- Government departments and agencies
- Companies House (Member/Trustees only)
- Academy Trust Members and Trustees (Members/Trustees/Local Governing Body Members and other volunteers)
- Local Governing Bodies (Local Governing Body Members)
- Our regulator
- Suppliers and service providers e.g., HR, Catering, Training
- Our Auditors
- Health authorities
- Security organisations
- Professional advisors and consultants
- Charities and Voluntary Organisations
- Law enforcement officials, e.g., police, courts, tribunals

We do not share information about our Members/Trustees/Governors/LGB Members and other volunteers unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Please refer to the tables below for information about what personal information is shared with which specific third parties.

International Data Transfers

Where we transfer your personal data to a third-party country or territory, we will do so in accordance with UK data protection law.

In cases where we have to set up safeguarding arrangements to complete this transfer, you can get a copy of these arrangements by contacting us.

What do we do with your information?

All personal information is held in a manner which is compliant with Data Protection legislation. Personal information is only processed for the purpose it was collected. Grace Academy Darlaston monitors the personal information it processes and will only share personal information with a third party if it has a legal basis to do so (as set out above).

How long do we keep your information for?

In retaining personal information, Grace Academy Darlaston complies with the Retention Schedules provided by the Information Record Management Society. The schedules set out the Statutory Provisions under which the Grace Academy Darlaston are required to retain the information

What are your rights with respect of your personal information?

Under data protection law, Members/Trustees/Governors/LGB Members and other volunteers have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. You also have the right to:

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means
- in certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
