#### Young Carers

On Friday 9th June we held a young carers afternoon tea at Grace Academy. This was to celebrate our young carers and their families during National Carers Week. The event gave us the opportunity to invite parents into school to spend time with their child and young carer. We had a really tempting array of food for the families, which was thoroughly enjoyed. A young carer is someone under the age of 18 years old who looks after someone in their family or a friend who is ill, disabled, has a mental health illness or an addiction. There may be as many as 1 in 5 students in schools who are classed as young carers. At Grace Academy, we are working towards the young carers in school award. This is an initiative run by The Children's Society and the aims are:

1: UNDERSTAND 2. INFORM 3. IDENTIFY 4. LISTEN 5. SUPPORT

At Grace Academy, this now includes things like a weekly drop-in to support students as and when needed, a board in the corridor with all support information on for students and staff awareness of young carers. One of our young carers is currently designing a logo for Grace Academy young carers, things like this encourage the students to feel that they are really involved in something that is for them. Young carers can often be hidden due to things such as embarrassment, not realising that they are a young carer, or not wanting to be thought of as different. We are hoping that completing the award will enable more students to seek support if they too are a young carer.

#### Warwick Castle

## Careers activities 2023 – some highlights

Careers Fair: The academy careers fair provided students with the chance to speak to colleges, employers, universities, and training providers to find out what opportunities are available to school and sixth form leavers. The British Army were one of the organisations who attended the Careers Fair in February and students were able to practise landing an aircraft using a flight simulator. Overall, students enjoyed the session, and some comments from representatives of the organisations included, 'students were well-behaved' and 'asked great questions.'

Careers Week: MSC, in Darlaston supplies engineering products to companies worldwide, came to the academy to talk to a group of students from Years 8, 9 and 10, about the world of work and employer expectations. Students also experienced what it is like to wear protective clothing while working with equipment. Year 10 Careers Day: Students were involved in a range of workshops and tried their skills at changing a tyre, working at a crime scene, managing workplace challenges, flying a drone, improving their fitness, pitching a TV programme, taking blood pressures, and so on.



The day concluded with two presentations to the whole year group, one from 4Schools about Big Careers on the Small Screen, and the other from the DWP Support Schools on Post 16-18 choices, explaining what is available to students after Year 11. Feedback from students included 'the day inspired me to make my choices'. Organisations who attended to deliver activities to students were Nova Training, Think Forensic, School of Coding, RAF, 4Schools, and Medical Mavericks, the DWP Support for Schools and the use of Barclays LifeSkills resources.

Careers activities are organised based on student interests, while other activities are provided to raise aspirations, inspire students, help students with getting information on the jobs they are interested in, or to help get career ideas.
